Other: Start of abuse, duration of abuse, type and duration of the relationship with the perpetrator, forms and type of abuse, injuries related to the incident (physical, psychological, sexual), medical treatment required, social protection/support required, previous violent incidents, health problems of the victim as a result of abuse, substance use by the victim, existence of violence in the family of the perpetrator/ victim, neglect/ abandonment of perpetrator/ victim in childhood, bring the perpetrator/ victim in environments with strict principles.

Protection order

Additional information: Data is collected about divorce; separation; custody; maintenance; contact; restriction orders; and temporary orders.

There is no formal quality assurance process, but the personnel involved is experienced and educated. The data is illustrating the operation of the centres and it is based on the victim's narrative. The narrative is converted to data on the spot and there is no another observer.

Additional information: The data is not timely because the victims report to the centres, when they decide to seek help and not necessarily when the violent incident occurs. The recording in the database is immediate.
