Types of GBV

- ✓ Intimate Partner Violence
- ✓ Rape
- ✓ Sexual Assault (excl. rape)
- ✗ Sexual Harassment
- ✓ Stalking

* The police does not systematically collect data on Intimate Partner Violence, but does flag it

Purpose of data collection

- Ensure victim protection from perpetrator
- Inform/evaluate policy
- Contribute to other organisation database
