NON. NO. NEIN. Say No! Stop violence against women

Violence against women is rooted in women's unequal status in society, and that status reflects the unbalanced distribution of social, political, and economic power among women and men in society. It is one of the most pervasive human rights violations of our time and a form of discrimination that results in, or is likely to result in, physical, sexual, psychological or economic harm or suffering to women (1). Violence against women undermines women's dignity and integrity and imposes serious harms on families, communities and societies. In the EU estimates suggest that 1 in 3 women (or 61 million out of 185 million) have experienced physical or sexual violence, or both, since the age of 15 (2).

The full extent of violence against women is difficult to estimate, as it is common to be under-reported and/or unreported, meaning that what actually gets reported is only a fraction of the reality. In France, 87% of the population tend to not be police (3).

In EIGE's Gender Equality Index 2013 it was found that when people tend to have more trust in public institutions, levels of declared violence are higher (5). It is estimated that in France, 46% of women have experienced violence, which is 11% higher than in the EU overall (6).

The European Institute for Gender Equality has estimated that the cost of intimate partner violence against women in France could amount to EUR 14 billion per year. This figure was calculated according to the methodology used in EIGE's 2014 study (7), which Member States can replicate, as done by Estonia in 2016 (8).
