

Gender Equality Index 2019: Germany



With **66.9 out of 100 points**, Germany ranks 12th in the EU on the Gender Equality Index. Its score is 0.5 points lower than the EU's score. Between 2005 and 2017, Germany's score increased by 6.9 points (+ 1.4 points since 2015). Germany is progressing towards gender equality faster than the EU. Its rank is the same as in 2005.

Germany's scores are higher than the EU's scores in all domains except in the domains of knowledge and time. Compared to other domains, Germany's lowest score is in the domain of knowledge (53.7 points), ranking 24th in the EU; its highest score is in the domain of health (90.5 points), where it ranks sixth in the EU. Germany's greatest improvement is in the domain of power (+ 22.6 points). There are regressions in the domains of knowledge and time (- 1.6 points for both).

Between 2005 and 2017, Germany's Index score remained lower than the EU's score. Nevertheless, its score improved most quickly than the EU as a whole. The distance between Germany and the EU has decreased over time.

Germany is catching up to the EU average



Each year we score EU Member States and the EU as a whole to see how far they are from reaching gender equality. The Index uses a scale of 1 to 100, where 1 is for total inequality and 100 is for total equality. The scores are based on the gaps between women and men and levels of achievement in six core domains: work, money, knowledge, time, power and health. Two additional domains are integrated into the Index but do not have an impact on the final score. The domain of intersecting inequalities highlights how gender inequalities manifest in combination with age, disability, country of birth, education and tertiary type. The domain of violence against women measures and analyses women's experiences of violence. In addition to providing a snapshot into the Index scores, the Gender Equality Index 2019 includes a thematic focus on work-life balance.
