

# Gender Equality Index 2017: United Kingdom



The Gender Equality Index 2017 assesses the progress and challenges in achieving gender equality across the European Union from 2005 to 2015. Using a scale from 1 (full inequality) to 100 (full equality), it measures the differences between women and men in key domains of the EU policy framework (work, money, knowledge, time, power and health). The Index also measures violence against women and intersecting inequalities. These are satellite domains and are part of the framework of the Gender Equality Index, but do not have an impact on the overall score. Intersecting inequalities show how gender intersects with age, education, family composition, country of birth and disability. The Gender Equality Index provides results for each domain and sub-domain for the EU and its 28 Member States (1).

### Progress in gender equality in the United Kingdom, 2005-2015

In the Gender Equality Index 2017 the United Kingdom achieved a score of **71.5 out of 100**. This is an increase of only 0.4 points. Despite being about two points ahead of the EU average progress in the United Kingdom has stalled. Its rate has decreased from 69.9 to 71.5 points. Only three countries have increased the score (but not quite), while one domain score has decreased and two have remained constant.

The domain of **gender** shows modest improvements, albeit the largest gains in women's representation in the Government in the political arena. Women's ability to contribute to the economic return has seen its improvement, while it has regressed in relation to risk of poverty. The score in the domain of **power** remains the lowest and is one of the greatest challenges for gender equality in the United Kingdom.

The domain of **knowledge** shows a regression in both educational attainment and gender parity, as well as in integration of work and family. The decline also points to the erosion of **time** allocated to social activities and care or domestic work.

The situation in the domain of **work** has slightly improved due to a combination of women's and men's improved participation in the labour market, time segregation and better quality of work.

In the domain of **money** a number of indicators show stable or slightly positive progress in the distribution of wealth.

Although unchanged from 2005-2009, the gender equality score in the domain of **health** is high, offering good gender balance in access to services and overall health status. However, there are large differences in the health-related behaviours of women and men.

The Gender Equality Index 2017 is based on the data of Gender in Decision-Making, the Gender Index Survey, European Health Interview Survey, EU Survey on Income and Living Conditions, Structure of Europe for age of retirement (Gender Equality), the Survey on Access to Justice, Conditions of Access to Justice, Economic Inequality and Skills in Europe (Living with Inequality), Gender Equality Index, Gender Equality Index, The use of parental leave (GEM) for data on maternity leave (Living with Inequality), and the indicators available for the indicators in other EU countries (Living with Inequality).
