

Good practices in gender training

The following pages present some crucial in the gender training in Europe. It also presents some good practice examples in their fields and gender competence perspective in specific sectors.

What resources, tools and methods are being used for gender training?

There are many generic tools, in EU Member States and international level, to promote mainstreaming, some useful resources include:

- The GENDER TOOLKIT** was developed as a part of the SO- funded "Fit for Gender Mainstreaming" project (2009-2010) which aimed to foster local and gender mainstreaming strategies through training. The TOOLKIT contains exercises for raising awareness on gender, a gender auditing toolkit, a collection of checklists and guidelines, and a materials set for Gender Impact Assessments. - Gender Impact Assessment** (Germany, Working Aid Gender Impact Assessment Gender Mainstreaming in the Protection of Legislation (2007), serves to facilitate the implementation of gender specific input to inform drafting legislation and provides support in assessing the impact of legislative legislation on men and women. - Climate change**: EIGE, in partnership with the Gender and Water Alliance, SHERA International Network on Gender and Sustainable Energy (SNGE), and WOCAT, has prepared a training manual on gender and climate change.
