
Unequal sharing of care responsibilities shapes gender inequalities in the labour market


Carers find it difficult to manage care responsibilities and maintain a work–life balance

Care responsibilities have impact on carers' working lives






Lifting the load: formal care services

Formal care services help to reduce the care load




Childcare for children under 6 years of age, more than 10 hours daily (%)







Carers providing long-term care daily (%)












Share of carers not able to access all the required formal services

Caregivers struggle to access all the services they need






Benefits of care services for gender equality



Investments in formal care services increases probability of gender equality





Strengthen, earmark and **increase investment and funding in formal care services** to improve quality, accessibility and affordability, particularly in areas with limited access, such as rural and remote regions.

2.

Take targeted measures to **challenge traditional gender roles** and actively promote the equal sharing of caring responsibilities and equal engagement in paid work of both women and men in all their diversity.



Ensure the **collection of EU wide gender statistics on unpaid care**, work-life balance and access to formal care services. Set ambitious quantitative targets at the EU level to foster increased coverage of long-term care services at a national level
