Brief summary of the workshop	Set the scene – European and international regulatory framework on preventing and combating domestic violence and VAW. Partnership and society mobilisation – developing non-violent attitudes and behaviours to achieve the goal of "zero tolerance" towards VAWG. Enabling access of VAWG survivors to specialist services – developing a comprehensive, consistent and quality system of survivor-centred social services.
