EIGE collects and further processes personal data pursuant to [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#) of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data (repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001).

### Purpose of processing

Pursuant to Article 44 of Directive (EU) 2024/1385 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 14 May 2024<sup>1</sup> (hereinafter, "Directive (EU) 2024/1385"), EIGE shall support EU Member States in gathering data on violence against women and domestic violence.

To this end, EIGE is undertaking a feasibility-testing study to support the development of a statistical measurement framework on cyber violence against women and girls. The study may involve the use of questionnaires, follow-up discussions and other related activities with relevant national authorities and data providers.

As part of this study, it will be necessary to collect and further process the personal data of designated contact persons participating in the feasibility testing study.

No decision is taken by EIGE in this processing activity without human intervention.

### Legal basis of processing

Processing is carried out in accordance with the legal terms of contract RS 01 implementing FWC EIGE/2025/OPER/05 – Lot 1 and article 5.1(a) and (c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

### **Types of personal data collected**

- Name and surname;
- Professional email address;
- Position and organisation;
- Responses to the data collection questionnaire and any follow-up clarifications (non-personal unless respondents voluntarily disclose)

### **Individuals who have access to the data**

Access to personal data is restricted to EIGE staff involved in the management of the project and the authorised contractor team (ICF S.A. and subcontractors).

No other third parties will have access to your personal data, except if required by law.

No transfers of personal data to third countries or international organisations (outside the EU/EEA) take place.

### **Retention policy**

Personal data will be stored only for the duration of the project and no longer than one year after the finalisation of the contract deliverables. After this period, all personal data will be securely deleted.

### **Security of your personal data**

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored on the secure servers of EIGE or of its authorised contractor. To protect your personal data, EIGE implements appropriate technical and organisational measures, including encryption, access controls and strict limitations on who may access the data (see point: Individuals who have access to the data). Contractors processing personal data on behalf of EIGE are bound by specific contractual obligations to apply adequate security measures and ensure confidentiality.

Your responses will be analysed in anonymised form. Any information included in publications, reports or presentations will be fully anonymised and, where appropriate, aggregated so that no individual respondent can be identified.

### **Your rights as data subject**

Within the limits set by Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, you have the right to access, rectify, erase and/or port your personal data, as well as to restrict or object to the processing of your personal data.
