

The Council of the EU calls for a more skilled and gender equal workforce

The Council of the EU has adopted conclusions on enhancing the skills of women and men in the EU labour market. Member States are urged to have a gender-sensitive approach in tackling participation rates in the job market.

Germany: up to 5700 women at risk of female genital mutilation (FGM)

Between 1500 and 5700 women in Germany are at risk of FGM, according to a recent German study. The research builds upon EIGE's methodology, which will soon be used in the Netherlands in an upcoming risk estimation study.

March definition: Horizontal segregation

This refers to the unequal concentration of men and women across occupational fields at the same level e.g. more women work in the educational sector compared to men. It is different from *vertical segregation*, which describes the male domination of top hierarchical positions.
