Joint consultation Meetings

Questionnaire on the collection of information and data on gender-related killings of women (femicide)

The purpose of this questionnaire is to prepare the participating national stakeholders for the discussion planned to take place during the meeting. The participants are asked to bring the filled out questionnaire to the meeting.

1. Has a definition on gender-related killings of women used for statistical purposes been established in your Member State? If yes, please provide it.
2. Are data on gender-related killings of women collected in your Member State?
3. Which institutions (governmental bodies and/or non-governmental organisations) collect the data? Which sources do they use and how are the data stored?
4. At which point is it established if a killing of a woman was a gender-related killing (femicide)? At which stage the case is registered as a gender-related killing (femicide)?

5. Are there any parameters to establish the killing as a gender-motivated (femicide) such as relationship, ways in which the killing was committed, etc.? Please indicate:

6. Is the official/administrative data shared with other institutions? If yes, which institutions have access?

7. When collecting the data on the victim do you include information on:
 - a. Age
 - b. Sex
 - c. Gender identity
 - d. Sexual orientation
 - e. Nationality
 - f. Education
 - g. Occupation
 - h. Applied for Protection Order

9. Is the nature of the relationship between the victim and the perpetrator recorded? If so, please indicate how.

10. Is it any variable included in order to unveil a gender motivation? Motivations for the killing may include:

- a. Context of sexual violence (may include sex workers)
- b. Prior intimate partner violence
- c. Prior complaints or requests for protection measures
- d. Recent separation
- e. "Shame or dishonour" upon the family
- f. Refusal to enter an arranged marriage
- g. Other (if yes please indicate)

11. Are there contextual variables collected?

- a. Weapon (How the victims were killed)
- b. Location (Where the body was found, where the killing occurred)
- c. Suicide of the perpetrator
- d. Children present
- e. Other killings in connection with the femicide
- f. Other (if yes, please indicate)

12. Is there any protocol in place in your country to investigate gender-based (femicide) cases?

13. Are the data on gender-related killings of women analysed? If so, who does these analyses? Are reports published on a regular basis? Have they ever been used to inform the design of new policies?
14. Which are the methods used to analyse gender-related killings of women and girls (femicide)?
