



Did you know that?

Only **22%** of all CEOs of public broadcasting organisations are women. Women constitute 68% of all graduates in journalism, yet **only 40%** of all media employees.

In 2013, the **European Institute for Gender Equality (EIGE)** conducted several studies in the area of women and the media. Among them was a report focusing on the participation and access of women to expression and decision-making in the media.



Knowledge Centre


